


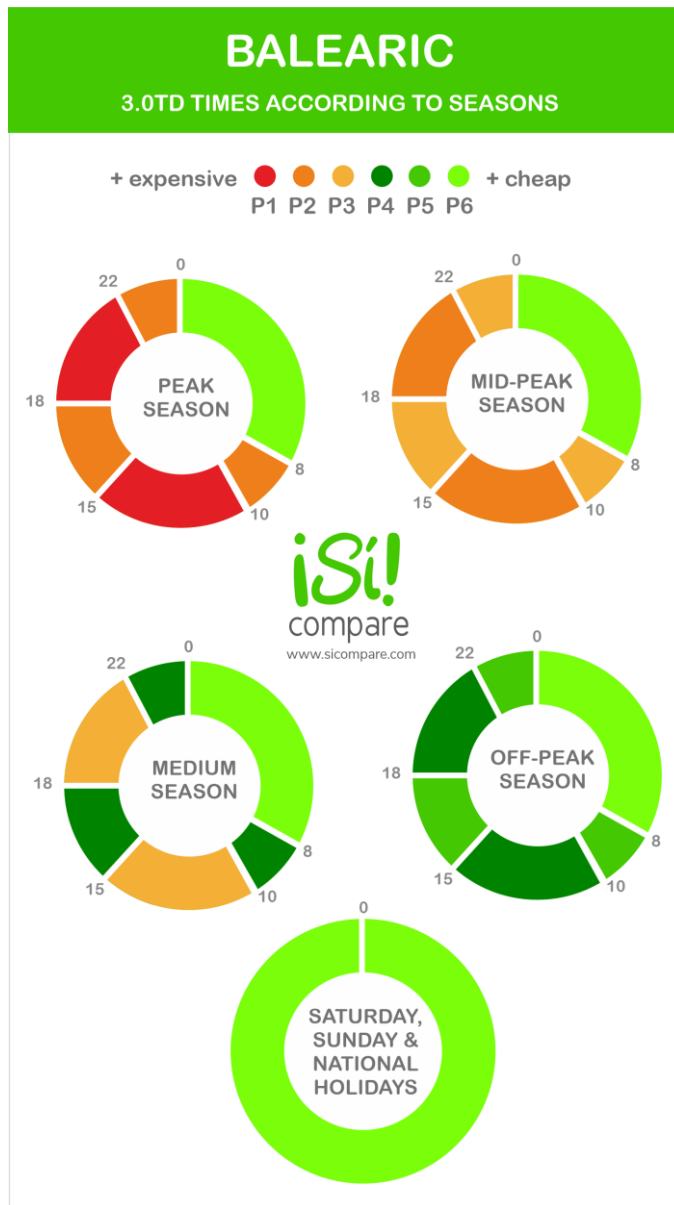
At the moment we had differentiated the seasons as Summer and Winter, but with this new change, the intention is to differentiate 4 seasons: peak season, medium-peak season, medium season and off-peak season).

The 4 seasons will be different in the Main Land, the Canary Islands, the Balearic Islands, Ceuta and Melilla. To make the most of keeping your costs as low as possible, refer to the below schedule to see the different seasons scheduled throughout the year:

Please find below how the price of electricity is distributed according to the season on the **Balearic Islands**. The energy billed during weekends and national holidays will keep the price of off-peak electricity, during all hours of the day, anywhere:
